Don't know what wood veneer HD might sell but if it's wood and unbacked, not for the faint hearted beginner. NBS backed is good with contact adhesive and of course plastic laminate like Formica, Wilson Art, etc. Most problems are due to not using 2 coats of glue; waiting too long or too short a time to apply or application in too cold temps. Other than that it's just what you say.
