The front speakers are built as a three-way system and uses the following components (see the picture above ...)- LF: Two JBL 2242H- MF: One JBL 2226H - HF: One JBL 2446HThe system really sounds terrific accept for the center speaker* and the surround speakers** currently used. Neither the center speaker nor the surround speakers are close to match the performance of the front speakers :-(Simply put, I need to build myself a new center speaker and new surround speakers! I have been looking at the Pi speakers for some while and I must admit that I'm a little bit intrigued to use the three-Pi (professional series) as center speaker and surround speakers in my system :-) However I'm not sure whether the three-Pi's are too large for my system. What's you opinion on this, Wayne?
