My questions are:- Who makes/sells a compatible woofer?- What specifications do I need to match in order to make an appropriate purchase? Starting with the dimensions (12"), power, req response, sensitivity. Cerwin-Vega has been no help!- If I were to upgrade the woofers, what specs will I be limited by (besides its 4-8 Ohm impedance).- What should I expect to pay for a pair of compatible woofers? I guess what I'm really asking is: Is it worth it? Or are the new speakers that much better? I've listened to a lot of new speakers in my day, but few can match the range and depth of my old 36-R's.Thank you in advance for being as complete with your answer as possible.Best Regards,p2

Check your area for a speaker repair shop that does recone and refurb of prosound speakers such as those used for sound production. They'll probably be able to repair your existing woofers and put them back in new condition, and you'll probably be pleased with the price too.
