Sometimes you still see them in use at rehearsal studios or in old clubs. I never heard a 5001, but I remember S.C. as a very hard hitting amp for the power rating, and not bad sounding really. Bi-polar direct coupled I think. Creative Acoustics in Raleigh, NC used to sell Soundcraftsman. (they might tell you about it too, if you can't find any more info online)Thomas

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Hi Don, I had one of the later Soundcraftsman (1990ish) amplifiers after they had been aquired be MTX. I used it with a pair of K-horns and it got the job done. Very Bryston like in its performance without the finesse of the more expensive Bryston amps. What that means is a ton of power with great impact, but lacking subtlety on the top end. Both the Klipschorns and Soundcraftsman amp/preamp have moved on, only one of them I wish I had back on an almost daily basis! Jerrod
