The cabinet is finished with Chilean Laurel burl with Satin wood surrounding the 4 piece burl matches. The trimmings are walnut as for the rear corner portions. The horns for the top of these are walnut. The maple one is just for the picture. They do indeed sound great.Bill

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This model is more complex and expensive. The biggest advantages are that the woofer doesn't have to serve as a midrange driver and that the walls don't have to act as reflectors in the midrange band. This is a shift back to the original design, as it was prior to 2000 when the two-way version was introduced.
