Kits include the speaker drivers, the connector panel, hook

compression tweeter and crossover network, kits also include the crossover, tweeter compensation cable assembly, Zobel woofer damper, and all cable assemblies are completed and ready to install. Every kit containing a compression driver also includes the horn flare and the bolts to mount the driver to the horn. So basically, a kit is everything you need except the cabinet, and the idea is that you will build them yourself or have a local cabinetmaker build them for you. Then you just install the components and you're ready to go.
