They really give the illusion of a lot of width and depth, with precise placement of instruments and performers. Music never sounds congested. They really excell in tonality, instruments sound real! And the suprise is they are very dynamic sounding. They will really get up and go without getting edgy or strained. The Voight or TQWT is said to act like a combination of a transmission line and backloaded horn. I was extremely skeptical, but doubt their capabilities no more. They would never replace a big horn speaker system for me, but they will never embarrass themselves either. I'll soon be starting the Seven Pi Pro speakers that I've been gathering parts for, for many years now. In the meantime, I've "practiced" and had some fun. Good Hobby!

One thing you might try is adding a super tweeter rolled off with a .5 - 1uF cap. A Radio Shack 40-1310 added to my R.S. 40-1534 folded TQWT sounds pretty darn full-range with the tweeters really adding a vital quality to the sound! Sweet!G.
