Pick a dollar figure and surf through the Parts Epress web site/catalog and see what you can pick from. PE has lots of choices including the sub amps. 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The specs look good for a midwoofer, but I might reconsider use of this device for a subwoofer. It has high power handling capability and good efficiency, and those will probably make it excellent for midbass punch. Qts is low so your box size will be small, but that is also why it might not be best suited as a subwoofer. It may work well as a sub in an EBS alignment though - Grab a copy of BoxPlot and see.

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BoxPlot will accept either values and I think if you switch between systems, it converts all the fields automatically.
