Lots of ways to attach it- I think the easiest is to use a spray adhesive that comes in an aerosol can. Of course, now that I'm typing this, I can't remember the brand I've used, but they sell it at Home Depot. I think it's made by Dupont. It's used for mounting photos, displays, almost anything and very easy to use, and much stickier than you'd imagine. I got R-13 with backing and tore the paper off cause for some reason it was much cheaper than the kind without backing. Don't forget some cheap work gloves you can use and throw away.

You're right about using R-13. Peel off the water barrier paper and attach it with white glue or with a staple gun. A powerful staple gun will drive the staples in firmly, and does a pretty good job. But if they come unlodged, you'll have them bouncing around inside. Using white glue eliminates that possibility, but it takes longer to do.

It's 3M Type 77 spray adhesive. Office Depot should have it too. I use it like contact cement - a good coat on each surface, let it dry until real tacky (but not gooey wet), and stick together. I used a staple in the corners too. An old belt and suspenders man.
