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Eminence uses the "A" suffix to designate 8 ohms impedance. Sometimes people omit the suffix, especially on models that are only available in 8 ohms like the Alpha's. Other models are available in some lines - "B" is 16 ohms, "C" is 4, "CX" is made for coax tweeter mounting and "LF" is tuned low and "HO" is tuned for maximum output.
