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Some have changed layouts slightly, and as long as the enclosure doesn't develop standing wave issues and volume and Helmholtz frequency remains the same, I think it should be alright. If a cabinet is made tall and thin, it makes some sense to check it with Martin King's spreadsheet for standing wave influence. And of course you can always measure it to know the results of any modifications.

In the begining the cone is stiffer and the whole thing's never moved before. Break-in happens with all speakers, I imagine. I think using wide variety of music is good, louder obviously causes more movement. Tupac rocks... These drivers probably break-in quicker than many due to lightweight cone and large magnet/voice coil structure. I did the stock layout. Nice looking box and dimensions, not a bad size in a room.

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
