speaker is more capable of high SPL. But running a tube amp, that isn't a consideration, whereas sounds good.

makes it tend to sound good on low power SET amps that might have trouble pushing the bass on other speakers. It also has a slightly underdamped alignment, which makes it provide useful bass response even when power levels are low and/or no boundary reinforcement is possible.
